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- All exams are in the Hall or gallery/Performance Space(special provisions) unless otherwise stated
- Arrive at school at least 30 minutes before the written start time of each exam
- Ensure mobile phones are completely switched off, they will be collected as you go into the Hall. No electronic devices or notes to be on person for any exam. (except Science Extension which will be conducted on a laptop)
- FULL SCHOOL UNIFORM to be worn for all exams
- Exams will be supervised by professional invigilators (not your school teachers) with the same rules and expectations as your HSC Exams.
- The last day of the exam period will be used to complete major practical projects. Attendance is compulsory.

Illness/Misadventure

- If you are sick or encounter misadventure and are *unable to sit* an exam:
 - a) Call to let the school know you are not sitting the exam
 - b) See or speak to Mrs James **no later than the day after your medical certificate expires** to organise a time to re-sit the exam.
 - c) Complete the Illness/Misadventure form (available online, in Mrs James's office and the Senior Study) and attach documentation (medical certificate etc).
 - d) Submit the form to Mrs James the day after your medical certificate expires or at the time organised to re-sit the exam (No longer than 1 week).

Note: Failing to complete the procedures above may result in a mark of zero.

Misreading the exam timetable does not count as a misadventure

- If you sit an exam but believe your *performance has been affected* by illness or misadventure:
 - a) Complete an Illness/Misadventure form (available online, in Mrs James's office and the Senior Study) and attach documentation (medical certificate etc).
 - b) Submit to Mrs James by the end of the exam period. If your request is upheld, your exam marks will be compared to your other assessment marks and may be adjusted if your performance is seen to be affected.

Malpractice

- Any malpractice / cheating during the exams may result in a mark of zero. See the Year 12 Assessment booklet for more information.

Exam Equipment List

- You should write in **black** pen.
- Make sure you bring spare pens to each exam.
- You may also bring a ruler, highlighters, pencils (should be at least 2B) and a sharpener, and a bottle of water in a **clear** bottle.
- You can wear your watch to your exams, but once you sit down you will have to take it off and place it in clear view on your desk. Programmable watches, including smart watches, will not be allowed in the exam room.
- Some exams allow specific equipment, as there may be some exam questions that require the use of this equipment, please check with your teacher or NESA online. If an item is listed as optional, it means that there will be no exam questions for which the item is essential. But you may bring and use it if you wish.
- All equipment you bring is subject to inspection on entry. Make sure any equipment you are allowed to bring, such as a calculator, is in good working order because an appeal under misadventure provisions for equipment failure will not be upheld.

What you *cannot* bring into your exam room

- A mobile phone. Mobile phones are not permitted in an exam room under any circumstances.
- A programmable watch, eg a smart watch.
- Any electronic device (except a calculator where permitted). This includes mobile phones or other communication devices, organisers, tablets (eg iPads), music players or
- electronic dictionaries.
- Paper or any printed or written material. You can ask your presiding officer for working paper.
- Print dictionaries, except where permitted in language exams.
- Correction fluid.

You are not allowed to borrow equipment during exams.
